

# Example of a Search in JSTOR

On the Library web site [<http://library.emmanuel.edu>], access *JSTOR* through the **Quick Links to Resources** drop-down menu option or through the **A-Z List of Databases** link.

**NOTE:** In *JSTOR*, there is usually a time lag in full-text content, and it may be necessary to retrieve recently published articles through a different database.

**Example of a search topic:** Courtly love or chivalry in Medieval Europe.

**AND** narrows your search to materials that contain the terms written in both search boxes.

**OR** can be used to increase the number of search results by searching for either one or both of the terms.

Choose which field to search.

You can check specific item type(s) to narrow your search to articles or books.

You may wish to limit the date range when you want to search for articles that have been recently published on that topic.

**HINT:** To access *JSTOR*'s e-books, click on the **E-Books** link on the library's homepage. Then go to Books at *JSTOR* on the E-books webpage.
